Canadian Peace Alliance Goals

The Canadian Peace Alliance is an umbrella organization of peace-related groups in Canada. The purpose of the CPA is to promote concerted action among its member groups through networking and information-sharing. The objectives of the CPA are to work towards disarmament and demilitarization, and the building of conditions and institutions for peace, equality, and social and economic justice by means of raising public awareness and influencing government. The CPA strives for gender parity, and regional, sectoral and English/French linguistic balance on all its committees and bodies. The CPA operates in Canada's two official languages. Membership in the CPA is open to any non-profit group concerned with peace, excluding political parties, if the group accepts the CPA's goals, structure and decision-making process.

The ongoing activities of the Canadian Peace Alliance are overseen by a Steering Committee, which is elected every two years. The composition of the Steering committee is determined according to a formula that ensures regional balance. The Canadian Peace Alliance uses a consensus-based decision-making model.
